


HOW SHOULD A LIBERAL DEMOCRACY REACT TO CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTION CLAIMS?

Gerard Hogan was a lecturer in law at the Law School, Trinity College Dublin between 1982 and 2007. He was called to Bar in 1984 and made Senior Counsel in 1997. He was appointed a judge of the High Court in 2010 and appointed a judge of the Court of Appeal in 2014. In October 2018 he took up a position as Advocate General at the Court of Justice of the European Union.

Ronan McCrea is Professor of Constitutional and European Law at University College London and a barrister. He is graduate of Trinity College Dublin and the London School of Economics and has graduate degrees in political science and in law. He was formerly a *référendaire* (judicial clerk) at the Court of Justice of the European Union and writes regularly for *The Irish Times* on legal issues.

Regina McQuillan is a palliative medicine consultant at St Francis Hospice and Beaumont Hospital. She has a particular interest for access to services for people from disadvantaged groups such as members of the Travelling Community, people with disabilities. She has an interest in education for healthcare students, staff and the public.

David Smith is Associate Professor of Healthcare Ethics in RCSI University of Medical and Health Sciences. He is responsible for the undergraduate and postgraduate healthcare ethical curriculum in the University. He is the Director of the MSc in Health Care Ethics and Law in RCSI.
