Title of project:	The social and political world of a British magnate in Ireland: The correspondence and career of Richard Boyle, first earl of Cork, 1634-41

Summary of findings:

The project sought to investigate documentary material pertaining to the first earl of Cork, Richard Boyle, and his social world, specifically in the 1630s. Through the research I have undertaken I have developed an extensive study of the earl's social world, but specifically how his world interacted with that of two of his sons, Lewis and Roger, whom he sent on a Grand Tour of the continent between 1636 and 1639. The project will result in a topic on this subject, the details of it and what it reveals about the social world of a mid-seventeenth century British aristocrat.
