

Sources

The Digital Atlas of Dungarvan is based on content from the printed Irish Historic Towns Atlas, no. 30, *Dungarvan/Dún Garbhán* by John Martin. Select material was extracted, edited and integrated with Ordnance Survey Ireland's National Townland and Historical Map Viewer, to produce the Digital Atlas. The printed atlas of *Dungarvan/Dún Garbhán* contains two distinct parts – maps and illustrations on loose sheets, and an accompanying text section. A selection of this material has been incorporated into the Digital Atlas in a way that offers the user alternative ways of accessing and interacting with the content. This section explains the sources used for the Digital Atlas with the aim of encouraging further research on the town of Dungarvan.

Maps

The printed atlas contains twenty-two pages of large-format, loose-sheet maps, illustrations and photographs. The following have been used in the Digital Atlas:

- Key map, 1841–51 (IHTA, Map 2). Original scale 1:2500, compiled from various sources, principally the Ordnance Survey 1:1056 manuscript town plan (1841), which covers the town of Dungarvan west of the Colligan River on one sheet. As there is no contemporary large-scale Ordnance Survey town plan for the Abbeyside, the urban area east of the river has been derived from the 1:1056 manuscript valuation map that was in use from 1851. The 1:10,560 Ordnance Survey map of Co. Waterford, first edition, sheet 31 (surveyed in 1841) has been used for detail on the outskirts of the town. The historic maps were georectified against the Ordnance Survey's WMS Map Genie Basemap LS ITM (national large-scale vector data created in 2015) and digitised using ESRI's ArcMap GIS software. This 'reconstruction' was created by the Irish Historic Towns Atlas and is considered the core map (Map 2) as it allows detailed comparison with other towns and cities produced in the Irish and European towns atlas scheme. Text

The topographical information section of the printed atlas includes details of over 1,300 urban sites. These are categorised in twenty-two thematic sections. Over 640 sites have been inputted and edited for the Digital Atlas for seven of those themes, listed to include their section number from the printed atlas: 10 Streets, 11 Religion, 12 Defence, 13 Administration, 14 Primary production, 15 Manufacturing, 16 Trades and Services.

Information on individual sites is available via pop-up boxes. References are supplied in abbreviated form in brackets after critical dates mentioned. The selected bibliography (important items devoted to Dungarvan) and general abbreviations (a more general listing for the study of Irish towns) provide a full list of the abbreviations and associated sources used during research for the Atlas. Many of these are available locally in the Waterford County Museum and Waterford City and Council Archive, Dungarvan.
